# RE-DEDICATION OF AND IMPLEMENTATION MODALITIES FOR THE CESSATION OF HOSTILITIES AGREEMENT SIGNED ON 23<sup>RD</sup> JANUARY 2014 BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH SUDAN AND THE SUDAN PEOPLE'S LIBERATION MOVEMENT / ARMY (IN OPPOSITION)

We, the Government of the Republic of South Sudan and the SPLM/A (in Opposition), (Hereinafter called The Parties):

**Acknowledge** the need for full implementation of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement signed on 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2014, and the subsequent agreements on the implementation modalities of 24<sup>th</sup> February 2014 and the Recommitment on Humanitarian Matters of 5<sup>th</sup> May 2014; and the Agreement to Resolve the Crisis in South Sudan signed on 9<sup>th</sup> May 2014;

**Regret** the numerous violations of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement, and the continued violence and destruction caused by these violations, and the avoidable loss of lives that has resulted from this conflict;

**Agree** to respect the declared cessation of hostilities, to cease all hostile propaganda, and to fully guarantee the protection of civilians;

**Recommit** to declaring the position of our forces, and to fully cooperate with the Monitoring and Verification Mechanism (MVM) to ensure that the implementation of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement is completed without hindrance or delay;

**Recognize** the grave threats posed by the humanitarian situation resulting from the conflict, and; commit to facilitate full and unhindered humanitarian access to all areas of South Sudan in compliance with the Agreements;

**Underline** that both parties are committed by national and international law to prevent the recruitment and mobilization of child soldiers, and that

the recruitment and use of child soldiers constitutes grave violations of the laws of war;

- Agree to rededicate to the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement of 23<sup>rd</sup>
  January 2014 and further agree to implement the Cessation of
  Hostilities Agreement in accordance with the "Implementation
  Modalities for the Cessation of Hostilities Matrix," and its addendum,
  as annexed below;
- 2. Agree to immediate and comprehensive implementation of all aspects of the Cessation of Hostilities Agreement and other subsequent agreements thereafter.
