SUBJECT: DINKA BOR COMMUNITY POSITION PAPER ON THE CURRENT CONFLICT CAUSED BY MURLE CATTLE RAIDERS AND CHILD ABDUCTORS

Your Excellency, the 1st Vice President and the high National Delegation, The current fighting between the Youth of the two States of Jonglei and Boma is caused by the persistent of the Murle Youth to continue cattle raiding and with child abduction and random killing of innocent farmers with intention to force them to abandon their villages as it has happened now most of the population are currently in Equatoria and Bhar -El Ghazal.

We are presenting this position paper to affirm to you that Dinka Bor is a peace loving community. We stand for peace agreements signed with neighboring community of Murle. Our culture as Dinka Bor taught us to love our neighbors; peaceful coexistence and respect for human rights. But Child abduction and killing of innocent people are unacceptable to us.

You are much aware of reports and media outlets that the Murle criminals or bandits are widely accused by Dinka Bor community and other neighboring communities of Nuer, Anyuak, Jie, Kachipo Mundari, Bari even Ethiopia across international border. These acts of cattle raiding and child abduction have created reign of terror among the neighboring communities without exception.

Peace Agreements Violation by Murle

Murle violated many agreements including the recent December 2016 Peace Agreement organized in collaboration of Jonglei and Boma states governments. The agreement was signed and witnessed from both sides by Paramount chiefs, Women leaders, Youth leaders, Church leaders, Local Government Ministers, neighboring states of Bieh and Fangak, Governors of Jonglei and Boma states, two national legislators (Hon. Deng Lual Anyang from Jonglei State and Hon. Kennedy Gaiyin from Boma State and head of UNMISS mission in Jonglei.

While we were still in Pibor attending peace agreement, attacks started and were intensifying in different parts of Jonglei State in Jalle, Duk Padiet, Gadiang, Baping Anyidi, Kongor and Maar to cite a few examples orchestrated by Murle raiders involving vicious killings of innocent women, abducting children and raiding cattle and destabilizing community environment.

In the month of December 2016 alone over 18,000 cattle were raided, more than 50 people were killed including two ECSS Pastors in Jalle and Baping and over 30 children were abducted. Murle raiders' activities of cattle raiding, child abduction and killing of innocent are on the rise to this far of 2017. The figures increased to 18, 664 cattle raided, 200 people killed, 50 children abducted and 75 people wounded as shown in our county records.

The community of Murle is heavily armed than any other community in the greater Jonglei and two Murle community leaders are responsible for this proliferation of illicit arms. It is Sultan Ismail Konyi, the current Governor of Boma state, who had been allied and militia commander for Northern Sudan Government fighting against SPLA/M for many years during liberation struggle and David YauYau, the current Deputy Minister of Labour, Public Service and Human Resource who had been a COBRA leader. The two did involve in the business of child abduction and cattle raiding and support their community in recruiting tribal militia against neighboring communities.

The rate of displacement among the Dinka Bor population is higher than any other community in greater Jonglei. As the records shown from State Government, National, Government and UN that major displacement of our people are caused by Murle resulting to Internal Displaced persons and Refugee Camps including cattle camps in the neighboring States. These massive numbers of displacement out of homes have caused people to become destitute and vulnerable. This is because of sporadic killing, abduction of children and cattle raiding by Murle. It is a serious violation of human rights and we request our National Government and international community to return our displaced people to their homes and help them out to contain the worsening livelihood and security situation.

Internationally, child abduction is a crime and violation of child rights. The community of Murle has institutionalized child abduction as a business, prestige and culture to be passed down to generations to come. Young Murle raiders are trained to abduct children from other communities for sell to wealthy Murle individuals and receive cows in return for marriage as alluded to in paragraphs above. This act of child abduction by Murle has affected thousands of families, whose children were abducted; that is out of. 10 children born in rural village of Jonglei State two or more children are likely to be abducted by Murle. Alarmingly, the trend has changed from cattle rustling in 15th and 16th centuries to mass killing or massacre innocent people in cold blood in 19th century onwards. For example, in recent years of 2012,140 people were massacred in Duk-Padiet and 120 people were butchered in Maar, Paliau and Jalle in 2013. In 2014, 32 people were killed in Kolnyang, than in 2016 Jalle, Baping and Gadiang attacks were graved and humiliating. They are just examples of major atrocities committed by Murle. This has been happening for over 100 years in addition to enormous child abductions. practices.

Recommendations:-

- 1. Bor Community is ready and willing for Peace talks with Murle. This peace talk will be negotiated by the community and youth leaders.
- 2. All abducted children must be returned to rightful parents.
- 3. Cattle and Goats raided in 2016 2017 by Murle must be returned to owners.
- 4. People killed and wounded must be compensated.
- 5. All perpetuators/ culprits of cattle raiding and child abduction must be brought to book
- 6. Find here attached records of Murle killings, children abducted, Cattle and goats raided.
