- The Anya nya infrastructure provided the road map for the final liberation of Southern Sudan.
- 8. The amazing thing about the Israel's support to Southern Sudan is the lack of strings attached to the aid. Prime Minister Golda Mayer made it clear from the beginning that:" if and when the Southerners have a chance of reaching a peace agreement with the north, the state of Israeli will not stand in their way " Israel never intended to take advantage of Anya nya by using them to tie down the Arab army in Sudan.
